Annual Currency review – to maintain currency, engage in at least 1 extended response wildfire incident within a 3-yr period.

Definition of roles and responsibilities including coaching and shadowing.

Oversight of wildfire is no longer associated with Line Officer Position (Regional Forester, Forest Supervisor, District Ranger). Agency Administrator competencies (certification level) supersede Line Officer Position - eg: District Ranger certified as Advanced may be the AA for a Type 1 Incident
